
HAYMILL VALLEY

Bath Road, Slough, Berkshire, SL1 3SR



Haymill Valley Nature Reserve is a peaceful wildlife haven with reedbeds and woodland. In 2006, a group of BBOWT volunteers began transforming Haymill Valley. Yellow iris and marsh-marigold provide a splash of colour in the reeds. The cover of the reeds suits reed warblers which nest there and even brightly coloured kingfishers may be seen flying along the stream. The reserve has two sculptures of kingfishers – 'Millie and Milo'!

COCKSHERD BLUEBELL WOOD

Farnham Lane, SL2 2PY



Cocksherd Bluebell Wood is a Local Nature Reserve. It is ancient woodland of particular scientific and heritage interest. The woodland covers approximately 4.8 hectares. Some plants growing here are beech, field maple, honeysuckle, wild cherry and rhododendron. Key animal species such as the stag beetle, green woodpecker and bullfinch can be found here! Bluebells (as the name suggests) are the star attraction in April.

BAYLIS PARK AND MEMORIAL

Balyis Park is the most historic park in Slough. The park and the adjoining Godolphin Recreation Ground were part of the estate of Baylis House, which was originally the home to Dean Hascard, the Dean of Eton College and, until the early 20th century, the Duke of Leeds. There's lots to see at Baylis Park such as formal landscaped gardens, a wildfowl pond, streamside walks and war memorial gardens. There's also a play area for the little ones!

UPTON COURT PARK

Upton Court Park is Slough's main sports park which offers naturally landscaped parkland with views of Windsor Castle and a variety of clubs and activities. Upton Court Park is Slough's largest park which has six football pitches, play areas, wetland and woodland areas, streamside walks and multiple natural areas. During the summer months, there are plenty of butterflies to see around the meadow area!

SALT HILL PARK

Salt Hill Park was the first public open space in Slough. It is 13 hectares in size which is equal to just over 18 football pitches! Salt Hill Park is Slough's premier park which offers a range of up to date facilities and activities including play areas, tennis courts, a skateboard area, and an outdoor gym. The park offers natural areas and streamside walks and there are mature hedges and trees - many of them date back to the parks original planting!
