## What are Local Nature Recovery Strategies (LNRS)?

They are spatial strategies to celebrate and recover nature across England. Together, they will cover the country in a Nature Recovery Network (NRN). They are shaped by local people who own, use, manage, live in, live from, enjoy and care about the land in different ways.

You have important on-the-ground knowledge, experience and ideas that come from living, working or volunteering in the area. There is genuine scope for you to influence how Berkshire works together to contribute to national nature recovery. Connect with other individuals and groups to find new activities, or to amplify what you do and share your vision.
